Obvious Injuries: Abdominal pain in left upper quadrant

Respiratory Rate: 36 breaths/minute

Perfusion: Radial pulse present. Cap refill 1-2 seconds

Severe Bleeding: No

AVPU or Mental Status: A/O x 3 (knows name, date/location and what happened)



Injury #1: Abdominal pain in left upper quadrant

OPQRST: 8 out of 10 severity. Constant dull ache that is sharp upon palpation. Generalized to the abdominal area

History Signs & Symptoms – Abdominal bruising and pain in left upper quadrant with guarding behavior noticed.

Allergies – sulfa drugs, hayfever

Medications - fexofenadine for allergies

Past History - None

Last Oral Intake – chips and soda

Events Leading Up To – Fell to the ground during the stampede out of the building; at least one person stepped on abdomen and was kicked several times.
